Hey Kids,

Have you ever heard phrases that people say about money and wonder what they are talking about?

Saving for a rainy day means to save money so it can be used when needed in the future.

Money doesn't grow on trees means that money is not easy to get or replace. Extra credit: the material that is used to make US paper money doesn't grow on trees either! It is made of cotton and linen (flax plant).

**Burning a hole in your pocket** is used to describe the want to spend money as soon as a person has it.

**Dollar for dollar** is used when comparing items, usually to find the best value (what you get for cost).

**Nickel and dime** is to pay little amounts on things, but over time that adds up to a big amount.

Worth its weight in gold is something incredibly valuable no matter how much the actual worth. It can be tangible (something physical you can touch), or intangible (something you can't touch). Did you know...1 ounce of gold is currently worth over \$1,700!

Did you learn something new? Test your family and friends to see if they have heard the phrases and if they know the meanings!



## **DOLLARS & \$ENSE** For Parents and Guardians

Do children understand the phrases about money they hear? In this issue, your child is being introduced to meanings of some money phrases. Below are some ideas you can use to demonstrate the phrases.

Opening a Kids Club or Dollars Savings Account is a great step in personal financial management! Saving for a rainy day allows money saved to be used for planned and unexpected expenses when needed.

Explain to your child that money doesn't grow on trees, it is usually gifted or earned, and can only be spent once. If you are talking to an older child you can expand on this to talk about thoughts on a future career and saving for training and education.

People can be savers or spenders. If your child is a spender, set a savings goal. When your child gets money, remember the goal to help keep it from **burning a hole in the pocket**, at least until the goal is met.

Take your child grocery shopping with you and pull out some food packages to comparison shop between brands. Look dollar for dollar to see if the packages have the same number of and amount per serving. Keep in mind that going with the less expensive item will only be worth the savings if it will be eaten.

Spending money on something wanted (not needed) is okay if it can be afforded, but it is easy to **nickel and dime** oneself. Buying gum when shopping once a week costs about \$2.99 each time, but once a week for a year adds up to over \$155.

Teaching your child healthy money habits is worth its weight in gold. Your child will be more comfortable to manage personal finances and make sound decisions.

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## HOMEMADE CHEESE CRACKERS



#### Ingredients

- 1 c shredded cheddar cheese
- 4 T butter
- 1/4 c grated Parmesan cheese
- 3/4 c flour
- 1/4 t salt

### Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Put all ingredients in a food processor\*; pulse until a dough ball forms. Wrap in plastic and refrigerate 30-45 minutes. Remove from refrigerator and unwrap; roll out dough to thin rectangle 1/16" thick. Cut shapes with small cookie cutter(s) or into squares with butter knife. Bake 10-15 minutes; cool, remove from pan and enjoy. Store in air-tight container.

\*If you do not have a food processor, mix well until ball forms

## COFFEE FILTER SUN CATCHER

1 white coffee filter per sun catcher Markers—any colors Water (in a cup or squirt bottle) Table or workspace cover

Scissors (optional)



Gather your supplies and place a cover over your workspace to prevent staining. Lay the coffee filter flat then color with markers. To mimic fall leaves, use red, orange, yellow and brown. Lightly splash or spritz water on the filter. Let sit to dry. When dry, tape your sun catcher to a window or cut into a shape (like a leaf!) and tape to window.






## TIC TAC TOE
